Position Title: VEHICLE MAINTENANCE MECHANIC

Job Family: Transportation

Reports to: Director or Supervisor of Transportation

### SUMMARY:

Under the direction of the Director-Transportation, perform skilled and semi-skilled work in the inspection, repair and maintenance of District vehicles. Incumbents may assist in journey-level repair and maintenance mechanical work in the inspection, diagnosis, and repair of District school buses and vehicles; perform required inspections, preventive maintenance and servicing of vehicles under the direction of a Journey Mechanic.

**ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:** To perform a job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed in the job description are representative of the knowledge, skills and/or abilities required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

- Perform skilled mechanical work in the inspection, calibration, maintenance and repair District school buses and vehicles including a variety of large and small diesel, gas and alternative fueled vehicles and equipment.
- Conduct inspections of District school buses as required by the California Highway Patrol and State regulations; ensure completion of vehicle inspection documentation, bus safety authorization certificates and related repair forms in compliance with applicable laws, codes and regulations.
- Identify and analyze specific vehicular malfunctions and mechanical impairments; perform automotive scan and diagnostics to determine required repairs needed, and specific replacement parts to be ordered.
- Perform scheduled preventive maintenance safety checks and inspections; ensure compliance with State regulations, smog standards and other requirements as assigned.
- Adjust, repair and maintain air and hydraulic brake systems; adjust and reline brakes; perform transmission, motor and engine inspections, overhauls, maintenance and repairs; perform minor and major tune-ups on District vehicles and school buses; rebuild or replace engines as appropriate.
- Repair and adjust clutches, pumps, carburetors, universal joints, gears and valves; remove and replace components such as batteries, ignition systems, alternators, starters, hoses, belts, bearings, spark plugs and a variety of other parts as needed; installs wiring as necessary.
- Service vehicles and equipment with fuel, oil, grease, water and hydraulic fluids; ensure proper fluid levels; lubricate gearboxes; drain and refill crankcases; replace starters, alternators, fuses; check and replenish air levels of tires; replace tires as needed.
- Inspect, diagnose, repair and maintain vehicle lighting, air conditioning, lubricating, emission, electrical and cooling systems as assigned; test and repair electrical circuits and components; replace seats and other interior components as needed.
- Maintain a variety records related to work performed including maintenance and repair records, receipts, reports and logs; estimates materials and supply needs.
- Operate and maintain a variety of hand and power tools, welding equipment, lifts, jacks, stands, testers, meters, presses and grinders; utilize computerized and specialized equipment in the testing, diagnosis and repair of vehicles; drive a vehicle to conduct work.
- Plan, organize and lay out assigned tasks; interpret diagrams, sketches, schematics, technical manuals and specifications; work from verbal and written instructions and work orders.

- Estimate labor, material and equipment needed for assigned projects; monitor inventory levels of
  materials and equipment; order, receive and maintain inventory of materials and equipment as
  needed.
- Perform electrical and acetylene welding, brazing and soldering to design, fabricate, modify and install various vehicle components; operate related welding equipment.
- Communicate with other staff, personnel and outside agencies to exchange information and resolve issues or concerns.
- Maintain a variety of records related to safety inspections, maintenance activities, repairs, inventory and assigned duties.
- Maintain shop and work areas in a safe, clean and orderly condition.

### Other Duties:

Perform related duties as assigned.

## **REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

## **Education and Experience:**

 Any combination equivalent to: graduation from high school supplemented by completion of an approved apprenticeship program in diesel and automotive repair and three years experience in the maintenance and repair of gasoline and diesel-powered vehicles and equipment.

## Licenses and other Requirements:

- Valid and appropriate California Class A or B driver's license with passenger and air brake endorsements with proof of insurance.
- Possession of a valid California School Bus Driver Certificate
- Valid First Aid Certificate or endorsement by the California Highway Patrol.

#### Knowledge of:

- California Code of Regulations Titles 13 and 17 for the California Air Resources Board.
- Laws, statutes, regulations and requirements of the safe transportation of students.
- California Highway Patrol Safety and Student Transportation law and regulations.
- Techniques, practices, theories and procedures of school bus, diesel, gas and alternative fueled vehicle and equipment maintenance and repair.
- Methods, equipment, tools and materials used in the repair and maintenance of vehicles.
- Diagnostic procedures for vehicles and equipment.
- Operation of computerized and specialized equipment used in the diagnosis and repair of vehicles.
- Proper methods of storing equipment, materials and supplies.
- Preventative maintenance practices.
- Shop math applicable to vehicle maintenance.
- Record-keeping techniques.
- Health and safety regulations.
- Proper lifting techniques.

## Ability to:

- Floor lift 95 pounds
- Perform skilled mechanical work in the inspection, diagnosis, maintenance and repair of a variety of large and small diesel, gas and alternative fueled vehicles and equipment.
- Operate computerized and specialized equipment used in the diagnosis and repair of vehicles.
- Make adjustments, perform tune-ups and maintain vehicle parts, systems and equipment.
- Adjust, repair and maintain air and hydraulic brake systems.
- Diagnose and repair mechanical and electrical malfunctions.
- Interpret and apply State regulations and other requirements for maintenance of designated vehicles.
- Read and work from diagrams, sketches, schematics, technical manuals and specifications.
- Communicate effectively both orally and in writing.

- Work cooperatively with others.
- Observe health and safety regulations.

#### Other Requirements:

 This position shall be part of the random drug testing pool in accordance with current Federal Department of Transportation Regulations and the policy of the District.

### **DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS:**

 Training Certificate from California Highway Patrol – Basic Inspection of Terminals (CHP-BIT) for CHP required school bus inspections.

## **WORKING CONDITIONS:**

## Work Environment:

- · Vehicle repair shop environment.
- Driving a vehicle to conduct work.
- Exposure to fumes, dust, odors and oil/grease.

### Physical Demands:

- Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate specialized equipment.
- · Seeing to perform inspections and repairs.
- · Hearing and speaking to exchange information.
- Lifting, carrying, pushing or pulling heavy objects as assigned by the position.
- Standing for extended periods of time.
- · Bending at the waist, kneeling or crouching.
- Repetitive hand and body motions.
- · Reaching overhead, above the shoulders and horizontally.
- Climbing ladders.

### Hazards:

- Exposure to chemical fumes and vapors such as gasoline and diesel fuel.
- Working in a cramped or restrictive work chamber.
- · Working around and with machinery having moving parts.
- · Working from heights and from/on ladders.
