ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The N.E.S.T Program, formerly referred to as ASES, collaborates and integrates with the regular school day and other extended learning opportunities while providing a physical and emotional safe environment, providing opportunities to build relationships, and to promote active student engagement through:

An academic element and an enrichment element

The academic element includes tutoring and/or homework assistance, as well as, supplemental activities designed to help students meet state standards in one or more of the following core academic subjects:

language arts, mathematics, history and social science, science, or computer training.

The enrichment element offers an array of additional services, programs, and activities that reinforce and complement the regular academic program to support positive youth development. Enrichment activities include physical education, arts & craft, music, sports, SEL, and STEAM. While in the program, students will also be provided a nutritious meal, as well as a snack, prepared and offered by the school's
